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Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Goals

- 70% of schools will meet their state CCRPI target.
- By the end of third grade, 90% of HCSD students will be able to read on grade level.
- By the end of fifth grade, 90% of HCSD students will master 90% of their basic fluency facts (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division) with automatic from long-term memory.
- By the end of fifth grade, 90% of HCSD students will be able to write an organized opinion piece in which they state their opinion and provide reasons supported by relevant facts.

School Goals

- Students will increase expressive language by 3%, as measured by ACCESS Oral Proficiency Levels rated level 4 and/or higher.
- Seventy-five percent of students will demonstrate at least one year of growth as measured by Fountas and Pinnell reading benchmark (K-5). The overall weighted proficiency level in ELA on the 2023 GMAS will increase by 3%.
- Seventy-five percent of students will demonstrate at least one stage of growth as measured by GLOSS. The overall weighted proficiency in Mathematics on the 2023 GMAS will increase by 3%.
- During SY23, at least 95% of the students will participate in 75% of the social/emotional lessons delivered during specialty classes.
- Increase the number of parents that attend CWES school events by 3%.

School/Teacher Responsibilities

- Provide opportunities for families to participate in workshops that address math and literacy curriculum and instruction
- Provide training to families to assist them with using technology and digital resources to improve their child's reading and math fluency

Family Responsibilities

- Read with my child and review the questions provided in order to expand vocabulary and increase reading comprehension.

Student Responsibilities

- Read every day for at least 20 minutes.
- Practice math facts and problem solving at home with an adult.
- Read and discuss the book provided by my teacher with an adult at home.
